"Hello Mr Walker

Following a visit to the site and a subsequent discussion with the owner, they have decided to move the fence back behind the existing retaining wall, where it will be reduced in height to 2 metres above ground level (from it's current height of 3.36 metres), although the panel which contains the doors will be retained at 2.1 metres to save having to remove them and build new ones.

We anticipate that these works will take place in the next 3 weeks.

I will update you further following my site visit on 12.7.17 (after annual leave) to ensure that these works have taken place.

Golden Valley Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNT) Briefing 2nd - 9th June 2017

<u>Crime Trends Abbeydore</u> An outbuilding at an isolated property was entered overnight on Sunday 4th/Monday 5th June and several items were stolen including a Husqvana chainsaw, a Stihl strimmer and a hedge trimmer Incident ref 77-s-050617

A BMC Race Machine RM01 road bike with a black Ritchie saddle and shimano dura ace pedals was stolen from a workshop in the garden of a property in the village at about 5am today (Friday 9th June).

The owner's dogs started barking but by the time they went to investigate they heard a vehicle driving away. Also taken were a Honda strimmer and a Stihl chainsaw. Below is a picture of a similar bike <u>Incident ref 80-s-090617</u>



<u>Clehonger</u> Once again the primary school has been broken into and damage caused to doors at the premises, this happened sometime over the half term break. A child's bicycle was thrown into the wildlife pond, along with a metal sign belonging to the school. Nothing was taken on this occasion. If you live in the village and are aware of anyone on the site when they shouldn't be, please call 101 and report it <u>Incident ref 67-s-050617</u> Between 2pm and 4pm on Wednesday 6th June, a house in Poplar Road was burgled. The offenders gained entry through a downstairs front window which had been jemmied open, and an untidy search was made of the entire house. Money and jewellery were taken.

A neighbour reports seeing a white BMW saloon in the area with tinted windows, it sped off from the area at around 2.30pm Incident reference 531-s-070617

<u>Ewyas Harold</u> A vehicle parked at the end of a residential drive on the Pontrilas Road was damaged between Saturday 3rd June and Tuesday 6th June; scratches and dents were left on the driver's door and the rear nearside wing <u>Incident ref 343-s-060617</u>

A house in the village near the Pontrilas Road was burgled sometime between Monday 5th June and Friday 9th June whilst the occupants were away. The offenders climbed over a side gate and broke wooden panels in a rear door to gain entry. An untidy search was made and it isn't yet known what was taken <u>Incident ref 223-s-</u>090617

<u>Kerry's Gate</u> Two large 47kg bottles of calor gas were stolen from an outbuilding at an isolated property sometime between Sunday 3rd/ Wednesday 6th June Incident ref 456-s-080617

<u>Madley</u> Wooden buildings at the Madley Environmental Study Centre in Stoney Street were broken into overnight on Monday 4th/Tuesday 5th June and again on the following night, and several cash tins containing money were stolen - please keep your eyes open for the empty tins as they will probably have been discarded nearby <u>Incident ref 145-s-060617</u>

<u>Peterchurch</u> An elderly resident from Wellbrookside was visited at 2.30pm on Wednesday 7th June by two males in their early 20's claiming to be from 'The Water Board', telling her there had been an explosion in the village affecting the water supply, and they needed to check all her water pipes. They came into her kitchen and one of the males wanted to look under the sink, the other made to go into the rest of the house.

Fortunately, the lady wasn't taken in by their story and told them she would call her brother to come round to see them. At this point they left, no car was seen or heard, and it isn't known which direction they went.



They were both in their early 20's with slight Irish accents, one was wearing a baseball cap and had a blue check shirt on. At least one of them was wearing black gloves Incident ref 526-s-070617

<u>Scams</u> We are receiving a number of calls from concerned residents reporting multiple calls from persons purporting to be from the HMRC.

The general theme is that answerphone messages are left asking the resident to phone a number back immediately or be threatened with legal action. If the number is phoned, someone tells the resident that they have defaulted on their tax and asks them to pay a (large) sum of money, threatening the resident that they will have their possessions removed and face arrest. The conversations are a more in depth than my wording and can be very convincing, enough to cause alarm and concern.

Please be advised this is another scam along the HMRC theme. The perpetrators continually tweak the theme, enough to scare and frighten some people. If you receive such phone calls delete the message, do not phone the number given; if you answer such a call hang up, do not divulge personal information. Please be vigilant to this, keep an eye on anyone who may perhaps be convinced by this as the callers persist by leaving multiple messages.

Good News The large metal box stolen from Clodock Church has been found in woodland near Abergavenny, along with most of the registers although unfortunately they were not left in the box and have become very damp. They have been returned to the church and specialist help will be sought to ensure the records are saved. Found Bike The bike pictured below was found near a farm in Clehonger - if you know who it belongs to, please get in touch.



<u>Mobile phones</u> We are now in receipt of our new phones, so please note the new numbers below, the old number is no longer in use and there's an answerphone message on there giving our new numbers. Can I remind you however that these phones are not monitored when we are off duty so only leave non urgent messages.

The phones are smartphones and we can use them to check our work e-mails, look at incident logs, write reports and many other things that we'd normally have to come back to the station for. Of course, we need 4g or Wifi to do this so we might be seen in a café or somewhere similar using our phones - so if you do see us - we are working and not on Facebook or playing games (honest!) Golden Valley Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNT) Briefing 9th - 26th June 2017

Good morning A much shorter edition this time, thankfully we haven't experienced the same volume of reported crime as last time.

<u>Crime Trends Peterchurch</u> A large shed in the rear garden of a property near Hinton was broken into in the early hours of Wednesday 21st June, and a Honda petrol lawnmower, a Stihl strimmer and chainsaw, a Tanaka hedghetrimmer and a childs scrambler bike were among items stolen. The padlock that had been forced off to gain entry was also taken.

A neighbour had reported a white Mercedes van acting suspiciously driving up and down Long Lane around 4pm on Sunday 19th June, which may or may not have been connected <u>Incident 120-s-210617</u>

Rowlestone A car was driven into the corner of a farmers field and set alight overnight on Friday 23rd/Saturday 24th June. The damage is so severe it will be very difficult to establish the full details of the vehicle, at this stage it is believed to be a VW Bora. If you have any information, please get in touch <u>Incident ref 199-s-</u> 240617

<u>Suspicious Vehicle Ewyas Harold</u> A white VW Polo **GF17HTY** was seen in Orchard Close at 12.30pm on Thursday 26th June where there has been a recent burglary. Unfortunately this wasn't reported to us until a few hours after the event so we were unable to go and look for it.

<u>Scams</u> One of our local businesses e-mailed us to report a call they had received last week, and wanted us to pass it on to other businesses that may be contacted by these particular scammers

"I just thought I should let you know that I received a phone call this morning from Mike on behalf of the magazine 'To The Rescue', advertising funds from which (so I was told) help support the police, fire service, ambulance, help for heroes etc etc.

He thanked us for our previous support last year and asked if we'd be prepared to advertise again.

We didn't advertise with them last year, and while he knew a lot about us, I remember the approach and suspect it's a scam.

I said I'd need more information in the form of an email so I could check credentials etc and ensure it wasn't a scam, which he said he'd send, but which I've not received.

Looking it up via google, it does appear to be a scam. His phone number was withheld.

I know other businesses were also approached last time, so may be targeted again too."

An elderly resident in **Wormbridge** had two young males call at his property on Friday 23rd June offering to cut his hedge. They were calling themselves 'Perfect Gardens' and spent half an hour on the job and charged him £240 which he paid. Trading Standards have been informed, they are aware of this company and will be investigating the incident <u>Incident ref 401-s-230617</u>

I have made a list of the more recent scam phone calls and tips on how to avoid becoming a victim which I am attaching to this briefing - if you have any elderly neighbours or relatives who are not online or in receipt of these briefings maybe you could print it off and pass it to them - it could prevent them from being conned out of their savings. <u>Crime Trends Clehonger</u> Overnight on Sunday 2nd/Monday 3rd July, a Nissan Pathfinder that was parked in Oak Crescent had the rear windscreen smashed. Nothing appears to have been taken from the vehicle <u>Incident</u> ref 115s 030717

<u>Madley</u> Sometime during the weekend of 24/25 June more damage was caused to the perimeter fence of the Madley Environmental Study Centre <u>Incident ref 446s 270617</u>

<u>Suspicious Incidents Ewyas Harold</u> A white Ford transit tipper with 'Perfect Gardens' magnetic signs on the doors was in the Pontrilas Road last week, the two male occupants were posting leaflets through doors offering garden services. DO NOT use this company, they are well known to Trading Standards and will do a poor job and charge excessively Incident 322s 020717

A W reg green Nissan micra was seen in the recreation ground, Ewyas Harold at 5.15pm on Thursday 6th July, two males were in the vehicle and described as 25-30 years old with a lot of tattoos, one had a piercing in his nose. They offered drugs to two young lads that were in the recreation ground, the offer was refused and the car left. It had been seen in other parts of the village the same evening Incident ref 680-s-0607117

Peterchurch A young girl was followed along the lane from Fairfield school by a black BMW with tinted windows at about 2pm on Thursday 6th July, she became concerned and stopped to allow the vehicle to pass, but it did not. She carried on walking, then saw some older girls walking their dogs in a nearby field so went over to them and stayed with them until the vehicle drove away. The male driver was described as white, wearing a 'beany'hat and a puffa jacket. Please let us know if you have seen this vehicle around, unfortunately we do not have a registration mark.

<u>Scams</u> This appeared in our mailbox the other day allegedly from 'Domain Administrator' We know it's a scam e-mail as the e-mail address is incorrect - we are now goldenvalley.snt rather than goldenvalley.lpt If you get a similar email DO NOT click on the Cancel Command button! (I didn't try it but I'm guessing the outcome would not be good!)

Two calls received today which are of concern & probably need to warn others of are:

Ecosurveyors – number withheld – the gentleman gave my mother's surname as the person he wanted to speak to (as she passed away a number of years ago I quickly ended the call). Obviously working from an out of date database – which isn't a crime in itself.

Digging further on google, I've discovered the attached link – it seems they like to test the efficiency of double glazing etc.http://who-called.co.uk/Number/01274723113



BT Routers – an Asian lady via 0013034274192 claiming to be calling on behalf of BT regarding my router (that old chestnut). I pointed out that we received lots of callers claiming to be from BT which were scams & enquired how was I to know she were genuine. To which she replied she had my account number which only BT could provide! I've asked her to email me.

Crime Prevention Tips from our website

'Sheducation' - simple tips to keep the contents of your shed safe this summer

With summer well under way, the majority of us will be taking the opportunity to get out and about in our gardens.

Many residents think the contents of their shed are of low value and so pay little attention to security, which makes it the perfect time for opportunistic thieves to strike.

Although West Mercia Police and other community safety partners do everything they can to prevent and reduce theft, you can take a number of steps to avoid becoming a victim.

All you need is a little 'sheducation':

Cars, bikes, tools, sporting equipment and other valuable items are often kept in garages and sheds. Keep them secure by fitting an alarm or a good quality lock.

Keep your fences, gates, sheds, outbuildings and walls in good repair to stop intruders getting in

Hang old net curtains on the inside of the windows to hide the contents of your shed

Chain large items such as bicycles together - it is much more difficult for a thief to carry away a number of large, heavy items all at once

Mark your garden tools and equipment with your postcode and house number

Grow thorny plants and bushes to prevent unwelcome people from entering your garden

Fit grilles or mesh to the windows

Register your property at www.immobilise.com
